

Operating Officer Joins Bank Staff

Appointed to the newly created position was Richard H. Jameson, formerly with the Las Vegas headquarters of the Valley Bank of Nevada.

Mr. Jameson conceived and implemented the first part time state banking office in Nevada which still is in operation at Pahump, some 65 miles west of Las Vegas.

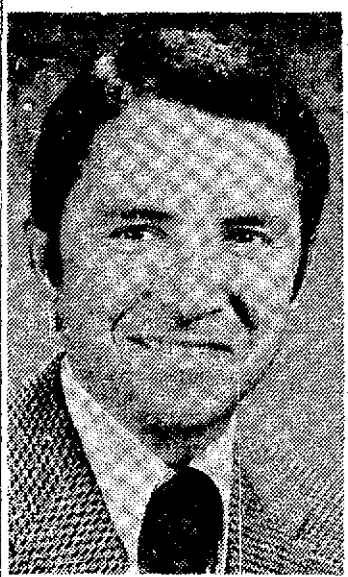

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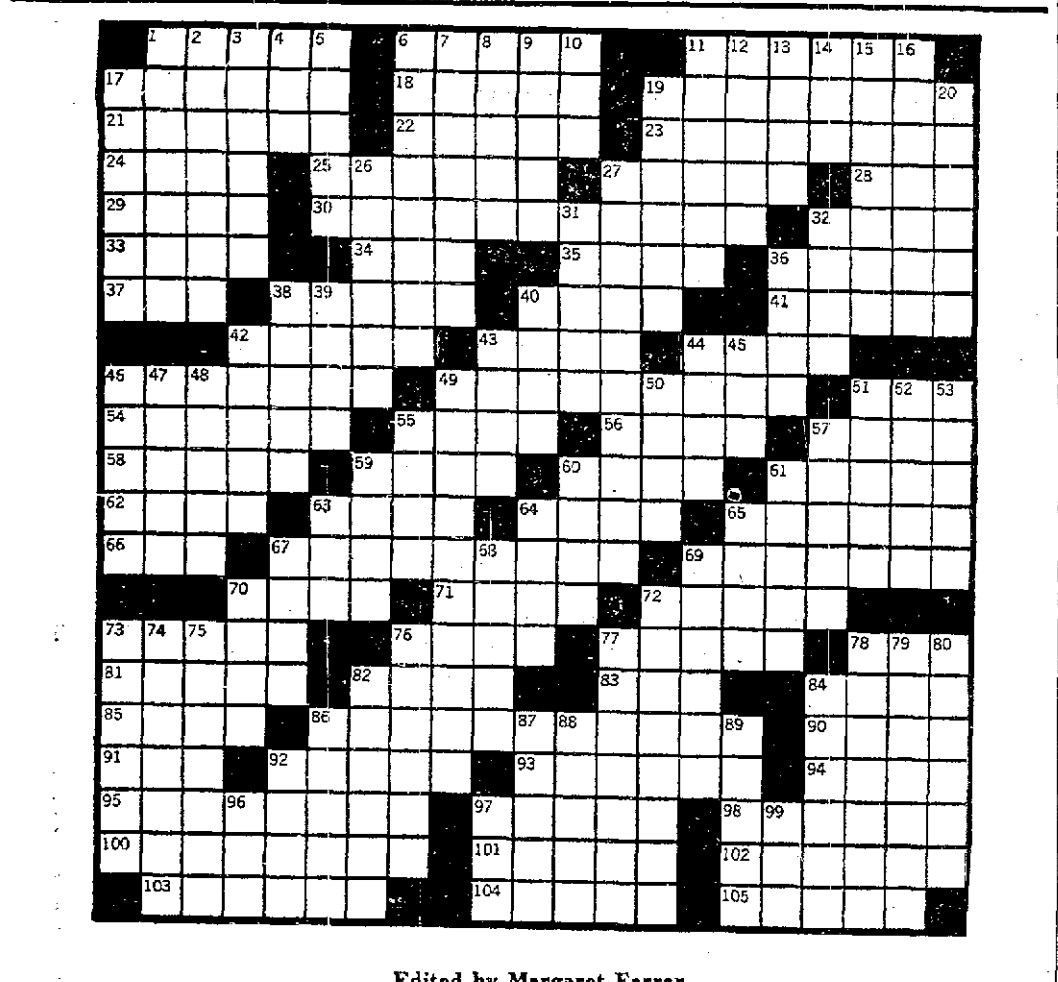
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SATURDAY CROSSWORD PUZZLE
