a plea to the manslaughter charge. Charles O. Prescott, 21, is charged in connection with the June 15 death of Judy Marchant, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Raiph Marchant. She was struck from behind by a truck while riding her bicycle at night.
Prescott's attorney, Dale Strafford, has been awaiting the filing of a bill of particulars by the Davis

County Attorney's Office before entering a plea.

The prosecution alleges Prescott was negligent in

causing the girl's death, charging that the brakes and lights on the defendant's truck the night of the accident were deficient.
The girl was riding her bicycle about 11 feet away from the curb and did not have lights on the bicycle, according to police.

A deputy county attorney said there appears to be a problem with the statute under which Prescott is charged. Under the criminal code the negligent death of another is manslaughter, a felony, but under the motor vehicle code the same action is negligent homicide, a misdemeanor.
