S.L. Panel Discusses Pros, Cons of Kaiparowits Plant

By Robert S. Halliday Tribune Environmental Specialist

A panel discussion of the Kaiparowits power project drew a capacity audience Friday evening in city commission chambers at the City and County

The pro-and-con presentation was aponsored by the Kaiparowits Awareness Group, a university student-based organization concerned about impacts

of power plants in Southern Utah scenic, areas. The group showed a color movie promoting the project, accenting its economic benefits to the Kane County area and the support of the local populace. The film was prepared by Southern California Edison Co. and Kaiser Industries, two of the project

Gordon Anderson, representing Friends of the Earth, a national environmentalist organization, then narrated a color-slide presentation of the slick-rock wilderness area involved and showed film of baze layers from the present Navajo power plant emissions spreading north over the scenic area and

"emission" smog clogging Grand Canyon.

To Multiply Haze Layer? He contended nitrous oxide emissions from Kaiparowits would merge with the plume from Navajo to multiply the haze layer over the area and reduce present 100-mile visibility to as little as 20

"Is the Colorado Plateau something we protect . . . or just remember?" he asked.

Salt Lake Mayor Ted L. Wilson moderated a panel of live. Each spoke for five minutes prior to a question-and-answer period.

Jack McClellan, representing the Sierra Club and Council on Utah Resources, said even with pollution control equipment operating at maximum efficiency and rated capacity, the Kaiparowits plant would emit 296.5 tons of pollutants per day, including 250 tons of nitrogen oxides which create haze.

He said Utah's "provincial elected officials are wooing the project" but stated that "no coal-fired power plants should be anywhere near national parks

Kim Young, speaking for Sen. Jake Garn, R-Utah. said the senator has studied information on the project, personally visited the site and "feels the plant can be constructed and operated without

William Wagner, BLM air quality specialist. provided information on the Environmental Impact Statement, including economic benefits of the plant

Rep. Lloyd Frandsen, representing Garfield. Wayne and San Joan counties, said, "We are satisfied the assets outweigh the liabilities.
