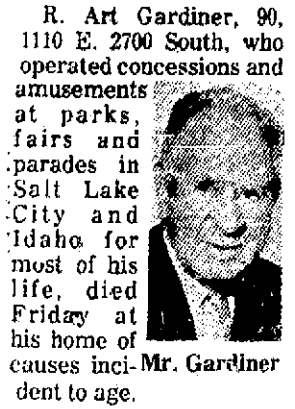


R. Art Gardiner Succumbs at 90



R. Art Gardiner, 90, 1110 E. 2700 South, who operated concessions and amusements at parks, fairs and parades in Salt Lake City and Idaho for most of his life, died Friday at his home of causes incl. Mr. Gardiner dent to age.

Mr. Gardiner owned the concessions at Liberty Park in Salt Lake City from 1913 to 1938. He continued to have a hand in the operations there until 1974.

Mr. Gardiner began in the concession business while still in his teens at the old Salt Palace at 9th South and Main Street. Before that, he worked at the Wilcox Home Drug Store across Main Street from Hotel Utah where Walgreen's now stands.

Sweetest Sound

Mr. Gardiner was quoted in a story in The Tribune in November, 1975, saying the sweetest sound in his life was hearing the squeal and laughter of children on a carousel.

He owned amusement apparatus in parks in Idaho Falls and Boise, Idaho, and was concessionaire at the Utah State Fair for 25 years. He at one time owned several cafes.

He introduced miniature golf to Utah and with the Salt Lake Tribune and Salt Lake Parks Department promoted the first fireworks at Liberty Park. He and his

son also helped promote the first Days of '47 Parade in Salt Lake City.

He was a boxing enthusiast and taught the sport at the Deseret Gymnasium for several years.

He was a former member of the Salt Lake Rotary, Salt Lake County, Knife and Fork, and Jordan Fur and Duck clubs. He also worked extensively on committees for the rehabilitation of delinquent boys. He was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Mr. Gardiner was born Oct. 22, 1885, in Salt Lake City, to Alfred and Susan James Gardiner. He married Claire C. Middley June 27, 1906, in Salt Lake City. She died March 22, 1958. He married Wave Hinckley on Feb. 22, 1964.

S.L. Panel Discusses Pros. Cons of Kaiparowits Plant

A panel discussion of the Kaiparowits power project drew a capacity audience Friday evening in city commission chambers at the City and County Bldg.

The pro-and-con presentation was sponsored by the Kaiparowits Awareness Group, a university student-based organization concerned about impacts of power plants in Southern Utah scenic areas.

The group showed a color movie promoting the project, accenting its economic benefits to the Kane County area and the support of the local populace. The film was prepared by Southern California Edison Co. and Kaiser Industries, two of the project partners.

Gordon Anderson, representing Friends of the Earth, a national environmentalist organization, then narrated a color-slide presentation of the slick-rock wilderness area involved and showed film of haze layers from the present Navajo power plant emissions spreading north over the scenic area and "omission" smog clogging Grand Canyon.

He contended nitrous oxide emissions from Kaiparowits would merge with the plume from Navajo to multiply the haze layer over the area and reduce present 100-mile visibility to as little as 20 miles.

"Is the Colorado River something we protect or just remember?" he asked.

Salt Lake Mayor Ted L. Wilson moderated a panel of five. Each spoke for five minutes prior to a question-and-answer period.

Jack McClellan, representing the Sierra Club and Council on Utah Resources, said even with pollution control equipment operating at maximum efficiency and rated capacity, the Kaiparowits plant would emit 296.5 tons of pollutants per day, including 350 tons of nitrogen oxides which create haze.

He said Utah's "provincial elected officials are wowing the project" but stated that "no coal-fired power plants should be anywhere near national parks or monuments."

Speaking for Kaarb

Kim Young, speaking for Sen. Jake Garn, R-Utah, said the senator has studied information on the project, personally visited the site and "feels the plant can be constructed and operated without destroying the values we cherish."

William Wagner, BLM air quality specialist, provided information on the Environmental Impact Statement, including economic benefits of the plant as well as the aspect of reduced visibility, which he termed "the most dramatic effect of emissions."
