Light candles

- Kadesh (קדש) ("Sanctify") 1.
 - Fill and drink first cup
- Urchatz (ורחץ) ("Wash") 2
- 3. Karpas (כרפס) ("Parsley")
- Yachatz (יחץ) ("Divide") 4.
- 5. Maggid (מגיד) ("Tell")

Fill second cup

Blood Frogs Vermin A mixture of noxious beasts Pestilence **Boils** Hail Locusts Darkness Slaying of the first-born

"Dayenu"

Drink second cup

- 6. Rachtzah (הרחץ) ("Wash")
- 7. Motzi (מוציא) ("Blessing")
- 8. Matzah (מצה) ("Unleavened Bread")
- 9. Maror (מרור) ("Bitter Herbs")
- 10. Korekh (כורך) ("Sandwich")
- 11. Shulchan Arukh (עורך שולחן) ("Prepared Table")

Eat meal (start with Beitzah)
