Fill and drink first cup

2. **Urchatz** (ורחץ) ("Wash")

3. **Karpas** (כרפס) ("Parsley")

4. **Yachatz** (יחץ) ("Divide")

5. **Maggid** (מגיד) ("Tell")

Fill second cup

Blood

Frogs

Vermin

A mixture of noxious beasts

Pestilence

Boils

Hail

Locusts

Darkness

Slaying of the first-born

"Dayenu"

Drink second cup

6. **Rachtzah** (הרחץ) ("Wash")

7. **Motzi** (מוציא) ("Blessing")

8. **Matzah** (מצה) ("Unleavened Bread")

9. **Maror** (מרור) ("Bitter Herbs")

10. **Korekh** (כורך) ("Sandwich")

11. **Shulchan Arukh** (עורך שולחן) ("Prepared Table")

Eat meal (start with Beitzah)

12. **Tzafun** (צפון) ("Ransomed")

13. **Barekh** (ברך) ("Blessing")

Fill and drink third cup
